Organ Dedication and Recital Planned

St. Petersburg: The public is invited to the Organ Dedication and Recital to be held at St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church, St. Petersburg, PA on Sunday, October 26, 2003 at 3:00 P.M.

An Allen Protégé Chamber Series Organ was purchased by the congregation in January 2003. The organ is an advanced electronic organ, one that harnesses a modern computer to create and control beautiful organ tones. The pipe-organ like tones of the Allen organ and the natural acoustical wooden ceiling of St. Peter's sanctuary combine to provide lofty music for worship.

Devotional music will be performed to the glory of God by St. Peter's church organist, Rose Marie Dehner of Knox, and guest organists Sharon Bond of Kane, and Stephen Winslow of Franklin.

Mrs. Dehner was organist at Salem Lutheran Church in Lamartine 24 years; substitute organist at various local churches, and is currently organist at St. Peter's Lutheran in St. Petersburg and St.

John's Lutheran Church in Emlenton. She participates in Schubert Club organ recitals and gives private piano and organ lessons.

Sharon Bond, a graduate of Fort Wayne Bible College, was organist at Tabor Lutheran Church in Kane for twelve years and currently is a substitute organist. She is a substitute schoolteacher also teaches piano and organ.

Stephen Winslow, a graduate of Anderson University, Anderson, Indiana, has been Organist/Choirmaster at Christ Church in Oil City for twenty years. He teaches private piano lessons in Rocky Grove, participates in Schubert Club, and provides dinner music at The Quality Inn in Franklin.

The Reverend Dennis Smith pastors the congregation and will lead the Dedication Service. A free will offering will be taken.

St. Peter's stone church is located by Route 58E, one block east of the U. S. Post Office. Turn onto Church Street, parking lot is at rear of the church building.

CEC Earns Extremely High Marks for Environmental Friendliness

Central Electric Cooperative (CEC) recently was awarded high marks from the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Bureau of Forestry for their commendable work as forest stewards in our area. They have 218 acres of forest that they have devoted the stewardship towards in Scrubgrass Township and Venango County.

Forest stewardship is a way of properly managing timber so it can be harvested with no impact on the land or the environment, while stimulating healthy tree growth. Wood that is certified costs a little more than other wood, but the consumer can be assured that they have purchased wood that has little impact on the future environmental problems.

CEC has done much more than that in our area though, and the lists of environmental accomplishments that they have achieved are astounding especially in regards to helping endangered animals in our area. Osprey are on the endangered species that they have helped by building special nesting platforms near Kennerdale along the Allegheny river and in Moraine State Park. CEC also installed osprey platforms up in the Tionesta area of Forest County for the Army Corps of Engineers, which also recognized the need to reintroduce this species.

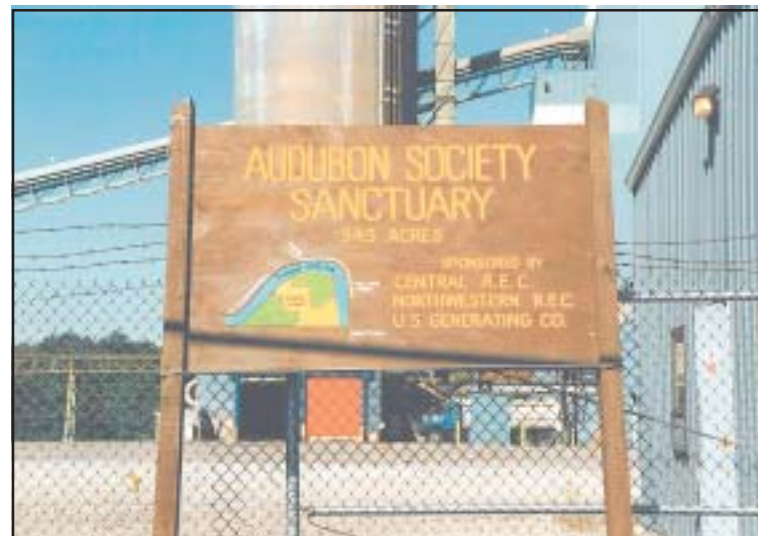
By 1986, Pennsylvania had only one pair of nesting osprey throughout the entire state. Today, accord-

ing to the Pennsylvania Game Commission, we now have over 40 pairs of these magnificent birds. Thanks to concerned people and dedication like what CEC provides to our environment, the children in our area might possibly catch a glimpse of this amazing bird that has a wing span of up to 6 feet. Because they are so large, they can easily be recognized and their distinctive color, dark brown above and bright white below, also help easily identify this endangered species.

This is not all that CEC has done for this bird though. According to Ken Maleski, the consumer marketing representative for CEC, they also built a three phase line through Moraine Park which included over 100 perch guards to protect the osprey from electrocution that can happen when an osprey lands on the lines of an electrical transformer.

Ospreys are not the only things that CEC have developed protection barriers for though. In many high population squirrel areas, the install special guards so that squirrels learn by receiving a very mild shock to not go near the transformer bushing, which can kill them.

CEC has also done many things to help reintroduce the otter population to the Allegheny River by providing property for their release on the river along with the U.S. Generating Corp. and Penn State University. About 20 years ago,



you could only find otter in the Poconos here in Pennsylvania, and thanks to the efforts of CEC and other concerned organizations, we can spot them on our beloved waterways.

Each animal in our environment has an essential role in keeping things balanced and healthy. By reintroducing and protecting these endangered and dwindling species, CEC has helped to ensure our neighborhood's future wildlife preservation.

Barn owls are also quickly moving up the possible endangered list and people from CEC have adopted two barn owls for the preservation of this distinct bird with help from the Moraine Preservation Council. Because of the many things that CEC has done to help

endangered bird life in our area, in 1998 they received a Corporate Business Environmental Award from the Bartramium Audubon Society too.
